Exam Conduct

Mobile and WAP-enabled phones are strictly prohibited and must not, under any circumstances, be taken into the examination room. If you are found in possession of a mobile phone or any digital audio device, eg MP3 player, or if you take this equipment into the room and it beeps or rings, your examination mark will be invalidated.

IF YOU MUST BRING A PHONE THEN CHECK IT IN AT RECEPTION!

Other things you must not take into the exam are:

- music/MP3 player
- a calculator which contains inappropriate data
- a calculator case
- a spellchecker
- a pencil case
- books, notes, sketches, paper of any kind, or any other unauthorised aid

If you mistakenly take any unauthorised aid into the examination room, you should give it to the invigilator for safe-keeping until after the examination.

All improper conduct will be reported. You may lose marks, have your examination entry in the subject concerned cancelled or, in extreme circumstances, have all your entries for the exams you are taking cancelled.

Additionally, the school will not be able to submit an assessment appeal on your behalf.

Examples of improper conduct are:

- misuse of examination material (including question papers, stationery etc)
- use of unauthorised materials in the examination room (including use of notes, calculators, dictionaries, digital audio devices, mobile telephones etc)
- copying from another candidate
- collusion - working with other candidates on an individual task
- plagiarism - failure to acknowledge sources properly and/or the submission of another person's work as if it were your own
- disruptive behaviour in the examination room
- sitting an examination for someone else
- using inappropriate, offensive or obscene words or drawings in examination answer books or coursework
