In 1983, Mr Charles Oxley founded the School as a Christian School and our motto, "grace and knowledge" is inspired by 2 Peter chapter 3, verse 18: "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ". Our current school values arise from this and they are: Grace, Confidence, Wisdom, Innovation, Compassion and Reflection. As a school, we continue to put these admirable qualities into practice individually and also as a school community.

Hamilton College has always placed an emphasis on the achievement of high academic standards. We have a proven track-record of success in SQA examinations year by year. Whilst academic success is often used as a measure of a school, we also pride ourselves on supporting each and every learner with first class pastoral care, allowing them to explore a range of opportunities in the co-curriculum, for them to discover their talents and to provide them with unique pathways for them to be the best they can be.

Over the years, we have supported many good causes with charitable donations. Recent beneficiaries of our giving include Beatson Cancer Charity, Teenage Cancer Trust, Operation Christmas Child, Bethany Christian Trust and Mission Aviation Fellowship.

In any organisation, investment is crucial. While the fabric of the building has been improved over the years, we aim to improve our premises further. Investment in ICT has been continuous, resulting in our being able to deliver the curriculum remotely, using digital technology, when most learners and staff could not attend school due to Covid lockdown restrictions. We continue to invest in the provision for our learners and with the Governors, we are investing in an expansion of our Nursery and we are also committed to improving our Science Labs, our Sports Changing Facilities and a Multi-use Outdoor Play Area. I do hope you enjoy reading more about these and can support us, as we look forward to bringing the School Community together, friend-raising and fundraising for our wonderful School.

In conclusion, I repeat my rejoicing at our anniversary and my invitation to you to celebrate it with us. When Hamilton College was not yet thirty years old, it described itself as a "young, dynamic co-educational school". As an organisation, we are surely still young at forty! As we mature, let our dynamism not flag with age! On our tenth anniversary, the then Principal wrote the following to parents: "I assure you that we remain dedicated to the best provision and preparation for life that we can possibly give your children." I have faith in a God who, having brought Hamilton College into existence as a Christian school forty years ago, can sustain it and cause it to flourish in the future. It is of course important to invest in our building and develop ICT provision and our co-curricular element still further, but let us not forget God. Psalm 127, verse 1 reads: "Unless the Lord builds the house, its builders labour in vain" (New International Version). I finish by quoting the words of the late eighteenth and early nineteenth century Christian missionary William Carey: "Expect great things from God - attempt great things for God". Let us not be afraid to put this into practice as we move forward into the future!




