




Vision & Purpose




OUR VISION

What does this mean for our pupils?

Our Vision, Purpose, Values and Foundation mean that within an environment shaped by key Christian principles and faith, our pupils grow and flourish as individuals, being encouraged, supported and challenged not only to develop their own skills, talents and gifts, but also have the confidence and selfbelief to then use these in the world to make their own future, to create their own impact.

Area of Focus 1 - Learning & Teaching for the Future

Belief

Every child is valuable and can be inspired to shape the world. Academic rigour creates wonder and opportunity. Creativity and innovation cultivate skills of collaboration, problem solving and critical thinking.

Aim

To develop children for work and life in a rapidly changing world.

How will we achieve this?

Innovations 2020/21:

- Collaborative teaching across the stages in Junior School
- Deploy 1:1 devices to pupils from J6 to S6 as an additional learning tool
- Introduction of foundation apprenticeships for S5 and S6
- New S2 course Languages for Life and Work, an exciting new language-for-life course
- New and innovative Science learning opportunities for J7 pupils led by specialist teachers

Innovations 2021/22:

- To engage with Microsoft to enhance digital literacy
- New National Progression Awards being offered where appropriate
- Enhanced professional development programme for staff

Ongoing improvement of best practice is evidenced in our School Improvement Plan.



Pupils are developed and educated to think for themselves, solving problems using higher order thinking skills. Confidence in pupils will grow, where curiosity to question is used in all learning opportunities.

As leaders of learning, staff will use the best learning methods, approaches and strategies to best meet the learning needs of all pupils.

Technologies will be used that prepare pupils for the world of work, enhancing learning by bringing research and collaborative working to the classroom to deepen learning and understanding.

Collaborative and high-quality professional learning amongst staff and the world-wide community enriches all aspects of teaching and learning.

Pupils are actively encouraged to follow their own unique pathway, accessing courses to suit their career choices and ability.

Pupils are engaged with society, giving of their time and skills to others.

Area of Focus 2 - Outdoor Learning

Belief

As growing respect for the environment creates positive impact on the world, learning will extend beyond the classroom; innovative projects enabling pupils to learn about and connect with the outdoors.

Aim

To enhance the outdoor facilities to increase spaces for learning, teaching and improving health and mental wellbeing.

How will we achieve this?

Innovations 2020/21:

- Creation of outdoor education space to inspire and stimulate teaching and learning for all age groups
- Upgrade of playground resources and equipment suitable for 5-18 year olds
- To enhance learning and teaching to develop exciting outside experiences across the curriculum
- Consolidate and expand the Nursery Forest School programme into J1 J3

Innovations 2021/22:

- Enhance and monitor links between use of outdoor space and outdoor learning with improved health and wellbeing
- Outdoor learning woven into curriculum
- Activities and innovative teaching and learning that increase awareness of local, regional, national and global concerns and the development of a range of sustainable responses



Pupils show a deep knowledge and respect for the environment, outdoors and facilities provided.

Teachers and pupils have access to increased outdoor education facilities and resources therefore creating more active and environmentally conscious pupils.

Pupil's confidence in their innovative thinking grows due to enhanced involvement in planning, execution and outputs of the project.

Area of Focus 3 - Partnership Working

Belief

Partnerships provide inspiration, encourage self-development and lead to effective learning outcomes. Quality relationships are key to transformational learning experiences. Sourcing skills, experience and expertise from external parties highlights the positive destinations of education and allows for reflection on skills developed.

Aim

To build a learning community for all to thrive.

How will we achieve this?

Innovations 2020/21:

- Improving links with local community and clubs
- Further development of toddler group in the Nursery
- Stronger links with colleges to deliver effective foundation apprenticeships
- · Encourage greater parental involvement in school improvement groups and missions
- Whole school photo competition and calendar for 2021
- Family STEM event to enhance parental engagement with learning across the curriculum
- Annual event to welcome and engage the community with the life, learning and work of the school

Innovations 2021/22:

- Specific J7 project designed to engage with the local community
- Develop family learning event planned to ensure whole school engagement
- Use of resources to develop a school community space within the current building
- Direct links with local businesses to enhance the learning within Hamilton College



Parents and staff have positive relationships built around supporting the pupil and the pupil's learning.

Greater parental engagement and involvement leads to enhanced partnership working, especially between the leadership of the school and the parent forum.

Parents feel involved in their child's education, they know what and how they are achieving and if support is required, what this looks like.

Community is welcomed and involved with the school and attends school events.

External parties contribute to the learning environment and provide relevant insight to pupils and teachers on today's application of education in the work place.
